RN Lena: So there is no empty room right now.

RN Lena: Well, cohort is the only way for us to handle the situation now.

RN Allison: _____

RN Lena: Perfect. I will move Mr. Albert to 421-1. Would you call environmental services to send someone to bleach the room?

RN Allison: _____

RN Lena: Thanks.

(In the patient room. Mr. Albert is Mr. Watson's roommate patient.)

RN Lena: Hello, Mr. Albert. I am your nurse Lena. How is everything?

Mr. Albert: Hi, Lena. I am OK.

RN Lena: Mr. Albert, we need to move you to another room.

Mr. Albert: Why do you need to move me to another room?

RN Lena: Well, we need this bed for another patient. The other room is as comfortable and nice as this one. You are going to like it.

Mr. Albert: That doesn't sound too bad. What room number is it?

RN Lena: It's Room 421 Bed 1. I just wrote the number on this card. I will put the card on your bedside table when we are in that room, so you can call your son to let him know you've changed rooms.

Mr. Albert: Thank you.

RN Lena: You are welcome.

(Transferring Mr. Albert to 421-1.)

RN Allison: Dr. Cohen just ordered Mr. Watson to be put on contact isolation precautions so we need to change rooms for either him or his roommate. The patient is suspected of C. difficile infection.

RN Lena: _____

RN Allison: That's the problem. We don't have private rooms available at this time. You know we only have 4 private rooms, and two of them are occupied by neutropenic patients. A suspected TB patient is in the negative pressure room, and a patient with pelvic cancer is having radiation therapy in the other private room.

RN Lena: _____

RN Allison: It seems that we will have to put Mr. Watson's neighbor into another room, so Mr. Watson can be by himself. Actually, bed control told me that a new patient is to be transferred to our unit from the ER; he, too, has a C. difficile infection. That's Felicia's patient. I'll put the new admission in the same room with Mr. Watson.

RN Lena: _____

RN Allison: Right. Let's go ahead and put Mr. Watson's roommate, Mr. Albert in Room 421. He is 92 years old and has invasive lines. He is a vulnerable patient and needs to be kept away from infectious agents. 421-1 is an empty bed; the patient in

Bed 2 is a young patient recovering from an appendectomy. I think the room is better for Mr. Albert.
